



## Deer Resistant Plants

Deer-resistant plants typically possess characteristics that make them unappealing or difficult for deer to consume. Many of these plants have strong aromas, such as lavender, rosemary, or mint, which deter deer due to their sensitive sense of smell. Some have tough, leathery, or fuzzy leaves, like lamb's ear or certain varieties of sage, which deer find unappetizing or unpleasant to chew. Additionally, plants with toxic or bitter compounds, such as daffodils or foxglove, are often avoided by deer, as these can cause discomfort or harm when ingested. Deer also tend to avoid plants with thorny or spiny textures, such as holly or barberry. While no plant is entirely deer-proof, those with these traits are less likely to be targeted in areas where deer are common.
